Volunteers Needed



Celebrating New Acquisitions

Recently the Emmaus Historical Society received a collection of rather rare Fire Department and Military badges via a donation from member Patricia Robertson of Minneapolis, MN. The Collections Committee began the task of cataloging and recording this collection into the permanent archives of the Society, which is when we truly realized what we had received. There were many fire department badges we had never seen before, with some dating to the very early days of Emaus Fire Co # 1 in the first decade of the twentieth century. Back in that era, many of the local fire departments would assemble and march in the parades of the various fire departments in the area. These badges, most likely worn by Patricia's grandfather, Harvey Kline of Emaus, were pinned on the marching uniforms to signify the department to which the participant belonged. . Another exciting part of this collection are the military themed badges that belonged to her father, Ira Kline, who was a veteran of WWI. These badges are from the Emaus WWI homecoming in August 1919, Emaus soldiers returning from the "border" in 1917, and the patriotic demonstration held in Emaus on July 4th, 1917. Several of these had never been known to exist before now. We always say that you never know what is still out there and what will show up at the Historical Society. These badges truly came full circle traveling with the Kline family when they moved to California, and later to Florida and Minnesota before coming back home to Emmaus where they can be preserved for future generations. We thank Patricia for her generous donation and her support of the Emmaus Historical Society. This is just another reminder to all that if you are cleaning out your house, or that of a relative, to please keep the Emmaus Historical Society in mind before discarding anything that you may not want or need.

Emmaus Tidbits

Many of us have been interested in genealogy and family trees

for some time. But have you considered the amount of history you uncover when researching your family? In researching my genealogy, I discovered some tidbits about The Emmaus Movie Theatre, which has been a popular local destination for years and has an interesting history.

The cinema began in the 1900s as a nickelodeon and evolved into The Palace Theatre at 364 Main Street in Emmaus, near the downtown Triangle. In the early 1900s, theatre owneroperators Miles Engleman and Dr. F. R. Lichtenwalner realized the need for progress in arts and entertainment, and during the 1920s, it was named the Penlo Theatre. In 1928. Dr. Lichtenwalner sold his interest to Mr. Engleman, who leased it to Perry Hoffman in 1930 and later sold his interest to Earl Tobias in 1933. The Theatre later was renamed The State Theatre. More changes and improvements were made over the years, but it is still a major business in the Emmaus community, now named the Emmaus Theatre and located at 19 S. 4th Street. The style remains nostalgic, as I

remember from the 1950s, but updated and showing current

movies at good prices. The popcorn is good, and you may even be lucky enough to win a free popcorn if you hold a lucky entry ticket. Even after all these years, the occasional train still elicits chuckles from the audience. Did you happen to know that our famed movie theatre served as the model for the illustration on the front cover of Stephen King's book "Hearts in Atlantis?"

Remember that The Emmaus Historical Society has a collection of Emmaus records including the Schwar Genealogy Records, family histories, local history books and related data, and also including photographs and all the Emmaus High School yearbooks. We invite donations of any original family documents and history.

Capital Improvements Projects Update

For many of our local members, you have been able to experience the Emmaus Historical Society's journey from the beginning of the renovations and restoration of the building at 218 Main Street that was purchased in 2014. From the time of purchase until the Grand Opening in September of 2015, many hands assisted in preparing for the day that we could open our doors. Countless volunteer hours went into our new home as well as the use of some professionals to bring the new building up to code. The initial renovations cost the Society \$81,897 paid to outside contractors. This figure does not include what was spent on materials used by our volunteers. The initial focus to open the museum was on the interior of the building.

In 2017, projects were begun to work on the exterior of the building that was in need of restoration. The restoration and reparation of the front porch was funded in part by a Keystone Historic Preservation Grant awarded to the Emmaus Historical Society through the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, whereby the Society would be reimbursed 50% of the submitted restoration/reparation costs. Additional

restoration projects were also ongoing in 2017 and 2018 to the exterior façade. Deteriorating stucco was restored and the entire building received a fresh coat of paint. Roof repairs and a new driveway to replace a badly deteriorated one were also completed. The total amount spent in 2017 and 2018 on all of these restoration and reparation projects was \$108,710. The total outlay for the Society after reimbursement from the grant will be \$74,250. Added to the initial expenses of renovations, the Capital projects to date have totaled \$156,147. The Board of Directors would like to take this opportunity to thank each and every one of our Capital Campaign donors who assisted us in the funding of these essential Capital projects. We cannot express how grateful we are to all of you who made the completion of these projects possible. Of course, we still have more work and possible future projects will involve the reparation and restoration of the garage as well as the possible replacement/upgrade of the heating and air conditioning systems for better climate control in the museum. Additional funds will also assist us in paying down the current mortgage.
